MaTIK(Mabuting Tao, Itatanghal Ko)

is a contest designed to celebrate and showcase individuals who embody exceptional qualities of good character and integrity.

1. All participants must be bona fide students and teachers of public and private elementary, junior, and senior high schools in their respective divisions.

2. Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendents using the provided registration form. Strictly one (1) representative per level may represent their division.

3. Research and select a character from the Bible, history, or contemporary society known for their good qualities, virtues, and positive impact on society. Consider characters whose values align with your own principles and whom you can authentically portray.

4. Study your chosen character extensively. Read their biographies, writings, speeches, and the historical context surrounding them. Understand their beliefs, values, motivations, and the challenges they faced.

5. Record yourself portraying the character in a video lasting between 3 to 5 minutes. Along with your entry, you must submit the script used for your performance. Please ensure that the video includes subtitles for clarity.

6. The decision of the judges shall be final and non-appealable.

Criteria for Judging Content of Script (20%)

Characterization (30%)-Characterization focuses on how authentically and convincingly the impersonator embodies the character. It includes aspects like mannerisms, speech, and behavior, convey the character's virtues, and how closely they resemble the historical or contemporary figure.

Costume and Props (20%)

- This criterion considers the visual aspects of the impersonation, including costume, accessories, and props. The impersonator's appearance and props are historically accurate and effectively enhance the portrayal, impersonations pay attention to detail and successfully transport the audience to the character's time and place.

Creativity and Delivery (20%)

- Creativity and delivery evaluate the impersonator's ability to engage the audience and present the character in a unique and memorable ways, creative approaches in how the character's virtues and values are communicated, as well as the overall impact on the audience.

Video Quality (10%): This criterion assesses the clarity, sharpness, and overall production quality of the video. Judges will evaluate the resolution, lighting, color balance, and sound synchronization, considering how well these technical aspects contribute to a polished and professional final product. High video quality should enhance the viewer's experience, making the content visually appealing and easy to watch.

2. Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendents using the provided registration form. Strictly one (1) representative per level may represent their division.

It evaluates the emotional connection and the performer's ability to express the essence of the character or story. The piece should feel natural and authentic, as if the performer truly embodies the role.

 \bullet Delivery (quality of voice, fluency, pronunciation, blending & harmony) - 30%

This measures the technical aspects of the performance, focusing on how the voice is used to deliver the lines. The quality of articulation, fluency in speech, correct pronunciation, and smoothness in blending lines are crucial. For group performances, harmony and coordination in delivering the piece are also considered.

Stage Presence - 20%

This focuses on how comfortable and confident the performer is on stage. Stage presence includes good posture, appropriate gestures, and effective use of eye contact to engage the audience. The performer's ability to make an emotional impact or leave a lasting impression on the audience is a key aspect of this criterion.

Costume & Sound Effects (attire is related to concept, sound production) - 10%

This evaluates how well the costume and sound effects enhance the performance and align with the overall theme or concept. The attire should reflect the character or mood of the piece, and any sound effects should complement the atmosphere and emotional tone of the performance.

Creativity & Originality (innovation and uniqueness in presentation) - 10%

This evaluates the performer's ability to bring fresh and original elements to the presentation. It looks at how creatively the piece is performed, whether through unique gestures, innovative use of space, or imaginative interpretations that set the performance apart from others. This category rewards performers who take risks to add a personal or distinctive flair to their work.

The "AI Spoken Poetry" contest invites participants to create original spoken word poems that reflect a specific theme using artificial intelligence tools. Contestants are encouraged to utilize AI-generated voices or avatars to deliver their performances, allowing for innovative and creative expressions of poetry.

1. All participants must be bona fide students of public and private senior high schools and teachers in their respective divisions.

2. Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendents using the provided registration form. Strictly one (1) representative per level may represent their division.

3. Participants are required to create an original spoken word poem that aligns with the given theme. They must use Al tools to generate their spoken performance, which may involve Algenerated voices (using text-to-speech synthesis), Al-generated avatars (such as animated characters or virtual presenters), or a combination of both. The performance should not exceed 3 minutes in length.

4. Each participant is expected to submit a video of the AI-generated performance, whether it features an avatar or AI voice. Along with the video, a written copy of the poem must be provided, accompanied by a brief explanation (maximum of 150 words) of how AI was used in the performance, detailing the tools and process involved. Proper acknowledgment of the AI tools used in generating the script and performance is also required.

5. The video submission must showcase the AI avatar delivering the poem or feature the AI-generated voice reading it. Any AI-generated visual effects, avatars, or environments should be used to enhance the overall performance, ensuring they do not overshadow the spoken word content. Subtitles or captions are required and must be included in the video. Additionally, the video should be submitted in a high-quality format to guarantee clear visuals and audio.
