YOUNG CREATIVES CHALLENGE (YC2) SEASON 2 REGULAR, ELEMENTARY, AND HIGH SCHOOL EDITIONS MECHANICS, TERMS, AND CONDITIONS

A. OVERVIEW

In line with the *Malikhaing Pinoy* Program, the Department of Trade and Industry organizes the grandest battle of creativity through the **Young Creatives Challenge (YC2)**. This aims to inspire, recognize, and showcase creative talents.

YC2 Season 2 now also includes YC2 Elementary Edition and YC2 High School Edition. YC2 Regular Edition Categories will cover the fields of Songwriting, Screenwriting, Playwriting, Graphic Novel, Animation, and Game Development. YC2 Elementary Edition and YC2 High School Edition Categories will cover the fields of Songwriting, Short Story Writing, Graphic Novel Making, and Online Content Creation.

B. THE COMPETITION

- Eligibility.
 - a. Regular Edition The competition is open to all natural-born Filipino citizens ages 18-35, whether amateur or professional, participating either as individuals or as a group. Employees, affiliates, and immediate family members of the organizing entity (DTI) up to 3rd degree by affinity or consanguinity are not eligible to participate.
 - b. Elementary Edition and High School Edition The competition is open to all natural-born Filipino citizens ages 18 and below, enrolled in an educational institution from Grades 1 through Grade 12, whether amateur or professional, participating either as individuals or as a group. Employees, affiliates, and immediate family members of the organizing entity (DTI) up to 3rd degree by affinity or consanguinity are not eligible to participate.
- II. Original Content. All submissions must be original works created by the participants. Plagiarism or any form of copyright infringement will result in immediate disqualification.
- III. Use of Artificial Intelligence. Participants must ensure that any use of artificial intelligence (AI) in their submissions adheres to ethical standards, including: (1) clearly disclosing the AI tools or models employed; (2) demonstrating originality and significant creative input beyond AI-generated content; (3) ensuring that all AI-generated elements comply with intellectual property rights; (4) avoiding promotion of harmful or unethical content, such as hate speech or misinformation; and (5) submitting to an approval process where organizers may request additional information regarding AI use. The YC2 Team reserves the right to disqualify any entry that fails to meet these ethical guidelines.
- IV. Theme. The competition theme is "Open Theme with Creative Tags: Love, Creativity, Future". All entries are open with regards to the subject matter, but all entries must also include elements relating to the Creative Tags.

V. Copyright and Usage Rights.

- Participants retain full, absolute ownership, copyright, and related rights of their submitted creative work;
- By entering the competition, participants grant the organizing entity a non- exclusive, royalty-free license to use and promote the submitted content for promotional purposes related to the competition only, and;
- c. The organizing entity shall not use the submitted works for any commercial purposes.

VI. Submission Deadline and Announcement of Winners. The timeline for this competition is as follows:

- VII. Publicity. By participating, winners agree to have their preferred screen names and submitted works featured in competition-related announcements and promotional materials.
- VIII. **Disqualification**. The organizing entity reserves the right to disqualify any entry that violates the terms and conditions, is inappropriate, offensive, or does not adhere to the submission guidelines.

The minimum number of submissions per category is set to 45 for all the entries to be considered as official. In case this is not met, the organizing entity has the right to adjust the award structure per disqualified category to ensure that deserving entries are duly recognized, even if the original target is not met.

- IX. Modification or Cancellation. The organizing entity reserves the right to modify, suspend, or cancel the competition if circumstances arise beyond their control, without any liability.
 - X. Acceptance of Terms: Participation in the competition implies acceptance of all the terms and conditions outlined herein.

C. SUBMISSION GUIDELINES AND JUDGING CRITERIA

- Language. Submission may be written in, but not limited to, English or Filipino. In case the
 creative work is written in another Filipino dialect/language, participants must also submit a
 document with the work's translation set to English.
- Number of entries. Any participating individual or group must join one (1) category and submit one (1) entry only.
- Content. It is of highest importance to foster a safe and respectful environment for all participants and audience. As such, any content that involves hate speech, violence, harassment, or any form of negative subject matter is strictly prohibited. It is encouraged that all contestants focus on positive and constructive themes in their submissions, promoting creativity, diversity, and inclusivity. When it comes to visually or mentally disturbing content, it

is essential to approach these topics with **utmost caution and sensitivity**, as they can have a significant impact on individuals. These topics include horror, psychological thriller, gore, war and conflict, dark fantasy, abuse and trauma, existential themes, social and political issues, and mental health disorders.

- IV. Adaptation. If the entry is an adaptation of another author's existing work, the contestant shall submit the written and signed consent of the author of the existing work, allowing the contestant to adapt the work, and to enter the adaptation in the competition. Entries commissioned by third party or submitted to other competitions are not allowed. Only unpublished/unproduced works are qualified and must be submitted to the official competition platform.
- V. Liability. Contestants must ensure that their work has not been submitted to any previous competitions or have been published for commercial use. The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) will be able to access the Work for competition purposes only. DTI does not have a non-exclusive, worldwide, royalty-free license to use, reproduce, distribute, display, and publicly perform the Work outside of the competition.

VI. Requirements and Criteria for YC2 Regular Edition.

a. Songwriting. In the creative sector, music plays a multifaceted and significant role. It is an artistic expression having the capacity to elicit feelings, convey stories, and establish meaningful connections with others. In line with the continued efforts to promote Original Pinoy Music (OPM), this category aims to bring together and discover more talents among the Filipino pool of musicians and composers. The following are the requirements and criteria for this category:

b. Screenwriting. The film industry in the Philippines has a rich history and has made significant contributions to the country's cultural heritage and entertainment landscape. This category aims to elevate this industry by providing world-class content and production plans, strategies, and promotions. The following are the requirements and criteria for this category:

c. Playwriting. This category provides a platform for artistic innovation, community engagement, and social impact while also contributing to the economy and cultural heritage. Its live and immersive nature creates unique and transformative experiences for both artists and audiences. With the rich and diverse Filipino talent, this competition shall be one of the many platforms in showcasing, nurturing, and celebrating theater arts. The following are the requirements and criteria for this category:

d. Graphic Novel. By providing distinctive narrative formats, highlighting visual creativity, increasing readership, generating adaptations, and influencing popular culture, graphic novels (also called comics, cartoon, manga, etc.) have made significant contributions to the creative sector. This category holds immense potential in the creative industry, offering digital and modern opportunities for flexible storytelling, artistic expression, boosted gaming and interactive media, and a lot more. Gathering Filipino animators through this competition provides a platform for diversity and inclusivity while driving industry growth by showcasing fresh talents and pushing the boundaries of animation as an art form. The following are the requirements and criteria for this category:

In line with the continued efforts to promote Original Pinoy Music (OPM), this category aims to develop young talents into the next great Filipino Songwriters.
