2025 DIVISION SNED ABILYMPICS – STORY INTERPRETATION IN FILIPINO SIGN LANGUAGE AND UNIFIED ENGLISH BRAILLE

- 1. The Schools Division of Nueva Vizcaya through the Curriculum Implementation Division announces the conduct of the 2025 Division Festival of Talents Special Needs Education (SNED) Abilympics on March 4, 2025 at Solano East Central School & Integrated SPED Center.
- 2. The SNED Abilympics will feature two exciting competitions:
 - a. Story Interpretation in Filipino Sign Language (FSL). This competition provides a platform for learners with disabilities (LWDs to showcase their skills in interpreting stories using FSL, effectively conveying the author's intended message and perspective.
 - b. Story Interpretation in Braille Reading, using Unified English Braille. This competition allows learners with visual impairments (LVI) to demonstrate their abilities in interpreting stories through Braille.
- 3. The participants in this activity are as follows:
 - Key Stage 2 learners (Grade 4 to 6) for Story Interpretation in Filipino Sign Language
 - Key Stage 3 learners (Grade 7 to 10) for Story Interpretation in Unified English Braille.
- 4. Detailed guidelines for both activities are attached.
- 5. The Technical Working Group (TWG) and coaches are requested attend the Staff Orientation Workshop at Solano East Central School & Integrated SPED Center on February 28, 2025 at 1:00 PM.







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

MECHANICS:

- A. Each region shall have 1 participant (Deaf Key Stage 2) for Filipino Sign Language.
- *The participant with the highest score shall automatically represent the region in the NFOT. In case of tie, the panel of judges shall decide on this matter.
- B. Published Story to be interpreted shall be provided by the NTWG of the said event aligned with the 2025 NFOT theme. The Published Story should not have more than 550 words.
- *The contest piece shall be given to the contestants in the actual event. *Order of performance shall be identified through draw lots.
- C. The contest is open for Grades 4 to 6 Deaf learners who are officially enrolled.
- D. An orientation of the guidelines, process flow and house rules shall be conducted before the contest proper.
- E. Each contestant is given 10-minute **Story Interpretation** which includes the following sequence:
 - Scanning, skimming and familiarizing the content of the story piece;
 - Story Interpretation proper:
 - ➤ The contestant shall interpret the printed story piece (placed on the bookstand) from Gawad Teodora Alonzo Story Books (English KS2) using FSL.
 - > The story shall be projected in a wide screen (situated at the side of the contestant) for the judges and audience. The bookstand shall be placed at middle of the stage.
 - · Creative presentation of the Moral Lesson of the story.
- N.B. *The contestant shall not introduce herself/himself.
- F. The judges shall be provided with the printed story piece during the contest proper.
- G. Only participants shall be allowed in the designated holding area one hour before the event.

H. Judging of winners shall be based on DO 36, 2016 (Awards and Recognition). The following awards shall be given:

 *The participant with the highest score shall automatically represent the region in the NFOT. In case of tie, the panel of judges shall decide on this matter.
- B. Published Story to be interpreted shall be provided by the NTWG of the said event aligned with the 2025 NFOT theme. The Published Story should have not more than 450 500 words.
 - *The contest piece shall be given to the contestants in the actual event. *Order of performance shall be identified through draw lots.
- C. The contest is open from Grades 7 to 10 Learners with Visual Impairment who are officially enrolled.
- D. An orientation of the guidelines, process flow and house rules shall be conducted before the contest proper.
- E. Each contestant is given 10-minute Story Interpretation which includes the following sequence:
 - scanning, skimming and familiarizing the content of the story piece;
 - Story Interpretation proper:
 - > The contestant shall interpret the printed story piece (placed on the table)
- F. Creative Moral/Lesson of the story should be creatively done.
- N.B. *The contestant shall not introduce herself/himself.

- G. The judges shall also be provided with the printed story piece during the contest proper.
- H. Only participants shall be allowed in the designated holding area one hour before the event.
