STATESMANSHIP SUMMIT V: GATHERING OF NOBLES

TRAINING DESIGN

I. Course Description

The annual Statesmanship Summit: Gathering of Nobles, designed to convene transformational leaders, is dedicated to fortifying the pursuit of good governance through statesmanship across diverse fields both in public and private sectors. This year's summit focuses on the theme "**Leading with Honor**," emphasizing the critical role of ethical leadership in fostering meaningful and sustainable change. Participants will explore strategies to embody statesmanship, anchored on integrity, accountability, and innovation, to address contemporary challenges and contribute to a brighter future for the nation. This year's summit expands its scope to include discussions on honorable leadership in different contexts, including the family, public service (elected and appointed positions), and the private sector.

II. Objectives

Performance Objectives:

Participants will be able to develop actionable strategies for integrating honorable leadership principles into their respective sectors, contributing to sustainable national development.

Learning Objectives:

- a. Identify the core principles of honorable leadership across various sectors and its impact on governance, organizational culture, and societal progress.
- b. Illustrate strategies for embedding honor and integrity in leadership practices within families, public service, and private entities.
- c. Develop innovative practices that embody honorable leadership principles.

III. Content

1. Keynote Message: "Leading with Honor"

Introduce core principles of honorable leadership, establishing the foundational framework for ethical governance across sectors.

2. Session 1: Honorable Leadership in the Family

Explore the family's critical role in developing honorable leadership, examining how family values shape future leaders and societal transformation.

3. Session 2: Honorable Leadership in Public Service

Explore leadership dynamics in government, recognizing unique ethical challenges and responsibilities affecting both elected and appointed officials and employees.

4. Session 3: Honorable Leadership in the Private Sector

Assess strategies for embedding integrity and ethical practices within private organizations, balancing objectives with social responsibility.

5. Session 4: Honorable Leadership in Public-Private Engagement

Determine collaborative approaches for cross-sector leadership, focusing on maintaining integrity and shared values in addressing national challenges.

6. Session 5: Innovative Practices for Good Governance

Explore technological and strategic innovations that enhance governance effectiveness while maintaining ethical standards.

7. Session 6: Strengthening Honorable Leadership Across Generations

Develop strategies for mentorship and knowledge transfer and create institutional cultures that perpetuate principled leadership over time.

IV. Venue & Set-Up

The summit will be conducted virtually via Zoom, ensuring accessibility for participants nationwide. A private Facebook Group Page will serve as a centralized hub for updates, downloadable materials, session recordings, and networking opportunities.

V. Participants

The summit is designed for leaders from various sectors, including:

1. Public servants (elected and appointed officials and employees).
2. Corporate leaders, SME owners, managers, supervisors, and employees.
3. Other members of the private sector (CSOs, cooperatives, People's Organizations, NGOs, membership associations, churches and fellowships, etc.)
