CONDUCT OF 2025 REGIONAL EXIT ASSESSMENT

Schools Division Superintendents To:

- The Department of Education Regional Office 02 through the Curriculum and 1. Learning Management Division (CLMD) shall conduct the Regional Exit Assessment (REA) with contextualized PISA from March 28-April 10, 2025.
- The test shall be administered in two (2) modes: Paper-pen Assessment and IT-aided/ Online Assessment (Grades 10, 12 and (Grades 3 and 6) Contextualized PISA for 15-year old learners).
- The test materials for Grades 3 and 6 shall be distributed to Schools Division Offices before March 28, 2025 and Monitoring and Evaluation shall be conducted by assigned RO monitors. DTCs are requested to submit the date of examination for Grades 3 and 6 (Paper and Pencil) and Grades 10, 12 and contextualized PISA (Online) at clmd.region2@deped.gov.ph.
- All personnel involved in the conduct of 2025 REA are advised to take precautionary measures on the effect of high heat index when discharging their duties and responsibilities.
- 5. Attached are the REA 2025 Implementing Guidelines and the List of Sampled Schools(can viewed be in link the https://tinyurl.com/2025REAListo/SampledSchools for your reference.
- Meals and travel expenses of personnel involved shall be charged against local funds subject to usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.



TITLE

IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES IN THE CONDUCT OF 2025 REGIONAL CONTEXTUALIZED ASSESSMENT- EARLY LANGUAGE, LITERACY AND NUMERACY ASSESSMENT FOR GRADE 3 AND EXIT ASSESSMENT FOR GRADES 6, 10 and 12 AND CONTEXTUALIZED PROGRAMME FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ASSESSMENT (PISA)

I. RATIONALE

Pursuant to the DepEd's mandate to ensure the delivery of accessible and quality education for all, assessment is an integral part to quality assure and assess the learners' progress in the attainment of the learning standards in all Key Stages as stipulated in the Enhanced Basic Education Act of 2013 of the K to 12 Curriculum. Along with the Key Exit Stage assessment, contextualized PISA is also administered to 15-year old learners. As assessment measures performance and to quantify judgment on academic performance of learners, the results of it will be used in research studies, decision making, planning, resource allocation, policy formulation and development of interventions.

II. SCOPE

This policy guideline covers the administration of the contextualized assessment for Early Language, Literacy and Numeracy for Grade 3, exit assessment for Grades 6, 10 and 12 and contextualized PISA in public schools of the region.

III. DEFINITION OF TERMS

- 1. <u>Learners</u>. Refers to Grades 3, 6, 10 and 12 pupils/students enrolled in the public schools for the current school year.
- 2. <u>Mother Tongue</u>. Refers to the identified mother tongue by DepEd Cagayan Valley Region specifically, Ivatan, Ibanag, Ilokano and Tagalog.
- 3. Regional Exit Assessment. Refers to the assessment of Grades 6, 10 and 12 learners of the K to 12 Basic Education Curriculum (BEC).
- 4. Regional Language Literacy and Numeracy Assessment. Refers to the assessment of Grade 3 learners of the K to 12 Basic Education Curriculum (BEC).
- 5. <u>Contextualized PISA.</u> Refers to the PISA-like assessment administered to 15-year old learners in public schools.


IV. POLICY STATEMENT

Regional Assessment for Language, Literacy and Numeracy for Grade 3 and Exit Assessment for Grades 6, 10 and 12 are major activities of the Curriculum and Learning Management Division's Contextualized Assessment Program which was initiated during the pandemic. This year, contextualized Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) with English, Science and Mathematics









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as core leaning areas is included. All types of assessment determine if the learners are meeting the learning standards and coping with the identified Most Essential Learning Competencies (MELCs) and meeting international standards. The assessment results shall also be used for research studies in the field to determine the teachers' effectiveness across the region and shall be a basis in providing technical assistance to improve instructional practices and learning delivery.

V. POLICY IMPLEMENTATION

1. Identification of Sample Schools

Selection of schools to be tested shall be done by the Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD) based on the data provided by the Schools Division Offices. SDOs may opt to replace the sample schools if need arises. SDOs are also encouraged to retain the sample schools tested in previous school year.

2. Test Administration

2.1. Target Clientele

Grades 3, 6, 10 and 12 learners from the schools to be sampled shall take the test. Examinees to be tested are those sampled randomly by the school. 15-year old learners from sampled schools will be randomly chosen to take the contextualized PISA.

2.2. Mode of Administration

- 2.2.1. Grades 3 and 6 shall be administered through paper and pencil test while Grades 10, 12 and contextualized PISA shall be administered through online platform.
- 2.2.2 Purposive sampling shall be used in the identification of sample schools. The administration of the test shall be across all Schools Divisions Offices. A random technique shall be used by teachers in the determination of test takers with parents/guardians' consent. For example, in a Grade 3 class, the teacher shall alphabetize the learners separately for males and females assigning a number per learner. The first 10 odd numbers for males and first 10 odd numbers for females will be taken to come up with 20 test takers.

For paper and pencil test, it shall be administered in 2 sets. Set A (10 learners) shall take the morning session while


Set B (10 learners) shall take the afternoon session.

For online test including the contextualized PISA, 20 sampled learners shall take the test in the morning of the examination day following the allotted time.









Test Booklets shall be used twice.



2.2.3 Test Schedule



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

2.3. Schedule of Administration

REA for Grades 3, 6, 10 and 12 and Contextualized PISA for 15-year old learners shall be administered at the end of the School Year.

2.4. Testing Procedure

2.4.1 Public school learners shall take the Paper-pen Assessment in Face-to-face modality for Grades 3 and 6 while online platform for Grades 10, 12 and contextualized PISA.

2.4.2 The table below shall be the basis in the identification of room examiners.

2.4.2 SDOs are responsible in the retrieval of test materials in the sample schools. Also, SDOs are requested to return test materials in the Regional Office.

Test materials with answer sheets must be at the Schools Division Offices two (2) days after the test administration. All materials must be retrieved by the Regional Office two(2) weeks after the test administration.

2.5. Testing Personnel


The specific duties and responsibilities of Testing Personnel to ensure the smooth and proper administration of the test are the following:

Regional Director (RD)/ Assistant Regional Director (ARD). The Regional Director / Assistant Regional Director shall oversee the smooth conduct of the test in the entire region.









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35% - 65%	Average Mastery (AM)
15% - 34%	Low Mastery (LM)
5% - 14%	Very Low Mastery (VLM)
0% - 4%	Absolutely No Mastery (ANM)

Percentage of Learners Achieving Proficiency Level shall also be computed using frequency counts and percentages with the numerical and adjectival values below:

90% - 100%	Highly Proficient
75%-89%	Proficient
50% - 74%	Nearly Proficient
25%-49%	Low Proficient
0-24%	Not Proficient

5. Reporting and Dissemination of Results

The results shall be released not later than 45 days after the examination. To maximize information dissemination and utilization of test results, the following data shall be released to the field offices:

- a. Regional Competency Skills Profile;
- b. Regional Performance per Learning Area and Key Stage including contextualized PISA;
- c. Percentage of Learners Achieving Proficiency Level;
- d. Least Mastered Competencies (LMC) per learning area; and
- e. SDO Mean Performance Scores per learning area.

The dissemination of test results shall be sent through a Regional Memorandum individually sent to SDOs and other modes of delivery. However, the data will be treated with utmost confidentiality in accordance to RA 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012.


VI. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

- The School Heads shall be responsible for supervising the implementation of the contextualized assessment program in their schools, ensuring that the provisions are properly communicated to all concerned.
- 2. The Regional and Schools Division Offices shall jointly monitor the compliance of schools through online with these guidelines. The Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD) and Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) shall collaborate with each other in ensuring that the provisions of the policy are complied with.









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3. Overall policy feedback from the Schools Division Offices shall be provided to the Regional Office to be used in evaluating the policy for continuous improvement of its design and implementation.

VII. EFFECTIVITY

This policy shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

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
