- With reference to the attached Circular Order No. 001, s. of 2025 from JCI Senate Philippines-Project W.A.T.CH Committee dated August 12, 2025, this Office in coordination with Schools Division of Cauayan City shall host the National Culminating and Awarding Ceremony of Project WATCH (We Advocate Time Consciousness and Honesty) cum Summit at Isabela Convention Center (ICON), San Fermin, Cauayan City on November 11-14, 2025.
- The activity aims to: 2.

 - d. discuss strategies and plans for further strengthening the culture of integrity through honesty and time consciousness among DepEd officials, teachers, and students in advancing Project WATCH's mission.
- Participants in this activity are Project WATCH Advocates, School Heads and Teacher of Public Elementary and Secondary Schools, Private Elementary School and Secondary School. Attendance of participants is on OFFICIAL BUSINESS.
- A registration fee of one Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00) shall be charged from each participant to cover meals, shirt, kits, honorarium of speakers during the Summit. The registration fee, accommodation, travel expenses and other related incidental expenses shall be charged to MOOE or any local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.



In line with the nationwide advocacy to promote time consciousness and honesty, the JCI Senate Philippines – Project W.A.T.C.H. Committee hereby issues the guidelines for the 2025 Project W.A.T.C.H. Implementation and the National Search for Best Project W.A.T.C.H. School for both public and private elementary and high schools.

Participating schools are required to submit the Pre-Entry Form on or before October 1, 2025, and all final requirements on or before October 10, 2025.

Entry Requirements include:

- Bid Book (60–100 pages) with narrative reports and documentation
- Video Documentation (MP4 format, max 8 minutes)
- Special Awards Entries (optional): Best Project W.A.T.C.H. Jingle, Best Project W.A.T.C.H. Impromptu Speech, Best Project W.A.T.C.H. Kick-Off Program

Judging Process:

Entries will be evaluated based on advocacy, training/orientation, club activities, and curriculum integration. Top implementers will undergo validation by the official Validation Team.

Winners:

All winners will be announced on November 13 during the National Recognition and Awards Day.

Prizes:

Awardees will receive cash prizes, a Project WATCH Trophy, a plaque, and a certificate.

BID BOOK

The following are the guidelines on the creation and submission of the Bid Book:

- The contents of the bid book must support and substantiate the entry for Project W.A.T.C.H.;
- Outside dimensions must not exceed 8.5" x 13" (21.59 cm x 33.02 cm);
- Any type of Bid Book is acceptable as long as it conforms to the specified outside dimensions;
- The minimum number of pages per Bid Book shall be 60 pages and the maximum shall be 100 pages;
- 5. A page shall be one side of a sheet of paper. The maximum size of a page shall be the size of the Bid Book 8.5" x 13" (21.59 cm x 33.02 cm). Foldout pages, gatefolds, etc. are not permitted;
- Each page of the Bid Book shall be numbered. The first two (2) pages shall serve as cover page and table of contents, respectively. These pages are **not included** in the required number of pages.
- Multiple page documents such as awards, bulletins, manuals, newsletters, magazines, copies of correspondences and other related documents are permitted and will be counted as one page.
- 8. The 100-page Bid Book must consist of comprehensive narrative reports about the school's advocacy, planning and implementation of trainings/orientations and activities, and curriculum integration, related to Project W.A.T.C.H.
- All attendance sheets, pictures, and other related evidence with regard to the narrative reports shall be included as appendix. Appendices are not included in the Bid Book page requirement.
- 10. Further, attendance sheets for different activities need may be displayed and checked during the validation; and
- 11. The Bid Book should have a label on its front cover indicating the following information:

VIDEO DOCUMENTATION

The following are the requirements on the creation and submission of the video documentation:

- 1. Must be a high-quality Audio-Visual Presentation in mp4 format;
- 2. Saved in flash drive (use of CDs/ DVDs is discouraged); and
- 3. Time duration must not be more than 8 minutes.

SPECIAL AWARD FOR BEST PROJECT W.A.T.C.H. JINGLE

The entry for best W.A.T.C.H. Jingle is optional. However, all schools are encouraged to send their W.A.T.C.H. Jingle entry.

The following guidelines shall be observed for the preparation, submission, and judging of entries for the Best W.A.T.C.H. Jingle:

- The Jingle must be about PROJECT W.A.T.C.H. No school must be identified with the song or lyrics; as the winning entry will be used as the official Jingle of Project W.A.T.C.H.
- 2. Time duration must not exceed three (3) minutes;
- 3. The jingle entry may either be in Filipino or English language.
- The jingle entry must be an original composition. Students and teachers are encouraged to collaborate and perform the jingle. Any musical accompaniment may be used.
- 5. Only ONE entry per school may be submitted. The entry shall be submitted in mp3 format, and saved in flash drive using the title of jingle entry as its file name;
- The lyrics and a short description of the jingle entry must be included in the flash drive in Word file format; and
- The name of school, number of participants and number/kind of instruments used must be included in the said Word file format.
- 8. The Criteria for judging shall be as follows:
 - a. Uniqueness 25%
 - b. Lyrics 25%
 - c. Melody 25%
 - d. Commercial Appeal 25%

Total: 100%

The decision of the board of judges will be final and irrevocable.



SPECIAL AWARD FOR BEST PROJECT W.A.T.C.H. IMPROPTU SPEECH

Guidelines for Impromptu Speech

The entry for best W.A.T.C.H. Impromptu Speech is optional. However, all schools are encouraged to send their W.A.T.C.H. Impromptu Speech entry.

The following guidelines shall be observed for the preparation, submission, and judging of entries for the Best W.A.T.C.H. Impromptu Speech:

Theme: (To be announced)

1. Participants

- The contest is open to all qualified students as identified by the organizing committee.
- Each school/organization may send only one (1) official representative.

2. Speech Mechanics

- The speech must revolve around the given theme.
- The participant will be given five (5) minutes to prepare after the theme is announced.
- Each participant is allowed two (2) to three (3) minutes to deliver their speech.

3. Language

- The speech may be delivered in Filipino or English.
- Mixing the two languages is allowed, but the dominant language must be consistent throughout the delivery.

4. Delivery

- No reading of notes is allowed. The speech must be delivered from memory.
- The participant must speak clearly and audibly, maintaining good posture and eye contact.
- Props, costumes, or visual aids are not allowed.

5. Judging

- Participants will be judged based on the following:
 - a. Content & Relevance to Theme- 40%,
 - b. Delivery & Confidence- 30%
 - c. Mastery of Language- 20%
 - d. Impact & Persuasiveness- 10% Total: 100%
- The decision of the board of judges is final and irrevocable.

6. Time Cue

 A sound will be heard as a signal for the participant to stop speaking once the maximum time limit has been reached.



SPECIAL AWARD FOR BEST PROJECT W.A.T.C.H. KICK-OFF PROGRAM

The Kick-Off Launch of Project W.A.T.C.H is highly encouraged but optional. This award is a special category applicable to all the schools who participated during the nationwide Project W.A.T.C.H Kick-Off on June 9, 2025.

- The special award shall be given to the school that shall best exhibit, on the day of the kick off, the practices that aim to strengthen punctuality and honesty that the school plans to implement for the whole year.
- The said kick off shall involve students, teachers, staff, stakeholders, and other members of the community. Most number of involved participants will receive high merits.
- Entries must be saved in the similar flash drive thru DEPED External Partnerships Unit-Special Events Unit (EPS-SEU) including the following:
 - a. Labeled folders based on different activities;
 - b. If the school decides to put a video, the video must be in .mp4 format with seven
 (7) minutes maximum running time;
 - c. The following information: name of school, number of participants / stakeholders; and
 - d. A narrative describing the preparations and implementation done relative to the Project W.A.T.C.H. Kick Off conducted by the school.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- All the required documents, including the video documentations and jingle, shall be placed in one flash drive only;
- Organize and label the said documents inside the flash drive;
- Place all materials for submission inside an envelope and label the envelope with the following information:

- Place the same information at the back page of the front cover of the Bid Book (info in item #8 says front cover - please check); and
- Submit all the requirements on or before OCTOBER 10, 2025.

SUBMISSION

The National Search for Best Project W.A.T.C.H. School is open to all **Public and Private Elementary / High Schools.** All interested schools must submit all requirements on or before **OCTOBER 10, 2025**.



JUDGING PROCESS

The Project W.A.T.C.H. Judging Committee will choose 10 Best School Implementers in Elementary and 10 Best School Implementers in High School following the set criteria for judging. All chosen schools will be notified for validation by the Validation Team.

CRITERIA FOR JUDGING:

Project Undertaken:	
Advocacy (Barangay/Community)	30%
Training Orientation (Teachers, PTA, others)	20%
W.A.T.C.H. Club Activities (Enrichment)	20%
Curriculum Integration	30%
TOTAL	100%

The list of awardees will be officially announced on **November 13** in conjunction with the celebration of the **National Recognition and Awards Day**. This special occasion will serve as an opportunity to acknowledge and commend the outstanding efforts and exemplary performance of all participants.

Prizes

Each winner will be awarded corresponding cash prizes in recognition of their achievement. In addition, they will receive a Project WATCH Trophy, a commemorative plaque, and an official certificate as symbols of honor and distinction. These awards aim to celebrate their dedication, commitment, and valuable contributions to the success of the program.
