COMMUNITY-BASED LANGUAGE IDENTITY DEVELOPMENT SPECIALIST TRAINING PROGRAM

Program Overview

This CBLID Specialist Training Program is a five-day, face-to-face intensive training designed for faculty, community leaders, linguists, and cultural bearers, with the collaborative support of SIL, ISU, and LGU Echague. The program emphasizes language vitality, identity, multilingualism, and sustainable language development, employing the Sustainable Use Model (SUM) and participatory learning.

Program Objectives

- Equip participants with up-to-date knowledge and skills for language documentation, revitalization, and sustainable development using internationally recognized models (e.g., SUM, EGIDS).
- Foster collaborative research and action among academic, governmental, and community sectors to strengthen local language identity and resilience.
- Guide participants in mapping linguistic ecologies and domains of use, and in planning actionable interventions responsive to community needs.
- Ensure joint data ownership and publication, and compliance with intellectual property, procurement, and university standards.
- Develop participants' capacity for reflective practice, monitoring, and evaluation in community-based language initiatives.

Target Participants

- · 40 committed ISU faculty members and from other Universities
- 10 community leaders/representatives and NCIP officials
- · SIL trainers, ISU, and LGU project representatives

Core Training Content and Activities

Day 1: Foundations

- Welcome and orientation; logistics overview
- Introduction: Purpose, roadmap, and program expectations
- Language situation: Past & present (participant reflection)
- · History & perspective: SUM and CBLID
- Timeline and overview: History of community language work
- Language ecology: Introduction and case study
- · Presentations and daily review

Day 2: Domains, Multilingualism, and Identity

- · Daily review and discussion on domains of language use
- Case study analyses (domains of use, multilingualism)
- Introduction to EGIDS and language vitality
- Group activities: Mapping community language use
- · Presentations and identity group discussions

Day 3: Identity Development and Community Strategies

- · Morning review and deepening group identity topics
- · Diglossia, FAMED conditions, and group reflection
- · Interactive group processes for planning identity interventions
- · Presentations, Q&A, and review sessions

Day 4: The Journey Model

- Introduction to "The Journey" (phases in language resilience)
- · Understanding history, language vitality, and ecologies
- Group activities: Mapping and planning interventions
- · Presentation of group action plans

Day 5: Project Planning and Evaluation

- · Monitoring, evaluation, and feedback sessions
- Action planning: Crafting community language development projects
- · Institutional compliance and publication protocols
- Concluding activities: Feedback collection, closing, and certificate signing

Roles and Compliance Mechanisms

SIL Responsibilities

- · Assign representatives for coordination and implementation oversight
- · Facilitate training, cover airfare and allowance of international speakers
- · Co-edit publication and social media materials, certify participants
- · Ensure strict adherence to project timelines
- · Observe intellectual property and data sharing as per MOA

ISU Responsibilities

- Assign ISU representatives for program logistics and documentation
- · Host and provide venue, accommodation, and technical needs
- Oversee compliance with COA, RA 9184, RA 10055, and RA 8293 for fund disbursement, auditing, and IPR
- Collaboratively develop, edit, and publish proceedings and other materials
- Evaluate and document program outcomes

LGU Responsibilities

- Assign LGU and community representatives
- Invite community/NCIP participants
- · Provide local support as per approved budget
- Collaborate in documentation and promotion, observe all reporting and evaluation requirements

Joint Implementation

- Create a Project Coordinating Committee with one representative from each party for planning, implementation, and evaluation
- Ensure regular coordination meetings, joint reporting, and dispute mediation as needed
- · Maintain shared ownership and publication rights for data and outputs

Post-Training Deliverables and Compliance

- Certificates of participation and completion signed by authorized representatives
- Jointly-developed proceedings and publications managed in compliance with agreed IPR and university protocols
- Completion of documentation, evaluation reports, and required government and university auditing practices


