REGIONAL MEMORANDUM

ORGANIZING AND STRENGTHENING MOVE IN THE WORKPLACE

To: Schools Division Superintendents
 Public Schools District Supervisors
 School Heads
This Region

1. The Department of Education is committed to upholding the rights and welfare of all its personnel, particularly women and children, by fostering a safe, respectful, and violence-free workplace. In line with Republic Act No. 9262 (Anti-Violence Against Women and their Children Act of 2004), Republic Act No. 11313 (Safe Spaces Act or Bawal Bastos Law), and Executive Order No. 273 (Approving the Philippine Plan for Gender-Responsive Development), the Department recognizes the critical role of men as partners and advocates in eliminating all forms of violence against women and children.

2. The Men Opposed to Violence Against Women Everywhere (MOVE) is a national campaign that encourages men to actively participate in preventing and addressing violence against women and children. By establishing MOVE Chapters in all Schools Division Offices, the Department aims to institutionalize gender-responsive practices and create a culture of accountability, respect, and protection. Specifically, it aims to:

- a. Establish and strengthen MOVE Chapters in all Schools Division Offices within the region;
- b. Engage men in active advocacy against violence against women and children (VAWC);
- c. Promote gender-responsive policies and practices in the workplace;
- d. Provide support mechanisms for victims of violence and harassment;
- e. Foster a culture of respect, equality, and safety within DepEd offices and schools.

3. All Schools Division Offices are directed to undertake the following:

- a. Establish a MOVE Chapter in the Schools Division Office;
- b. Designate a MOVE Chapter Coordinator and organize a core team of male advocates from various units/sections of the office;
- c. Submit the list of MOVE Chapter members and organizational structure to the Regional Office through the Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System.
- d. Comply with national and international commitments on gender equality and women's empowerment;
- e. Ensure that all MOVE Chapter members undergo orientation and training on gender sensitivity, VAWC prevention, and gender-responsive workplace policies;
- f. Coordinate with the Regional GAD Focal Point System and partner agencies for technical assistance and resource materials.

- g. Conduct information, education, and communication (IEC) campaigns on VAWC prevention and gender equality within the Schools Division Office and schools;
- h. Observe and actively participate in the 18-Day Campaign to End Violence Against Women (November 25 to December 12) and other relevant advocacy activities;
- i. Develop localized advocacy materials and programs that address specific needs and contexts of the division.
- j. Ensure the functionality and accessibility of the Division's Committee on Decorum and Investigation (CODI) and other grievance mechanisms;
- k. Provide assistance and referral services to victims of VAWC in coordination with relevant agencies (e.g., DSWD, PNP-Women and Children Protection Desk, Local Government Units);
- l. Establish a safe and confidential reporting system for incidents of violence and harassment.
- n. Integrate MOVE activities into the Division's GAD Plan and Budget;
- o. Monitor and evaluate the implementation of MOVE programs and submit quarterly progress reports to the Regional Office;
- p. Review and strengthen workplace policies to ensure compliance with gender-responsive and anti-VAWC laws
- q. Schools Division Offices shall submit the following to the Regional Office GAD Focal Point System.
 - r. List of MOVE Chapter members and organizational structure (within 30 days from receipt);
 - s. Annual Work Plan and Budget for MOVE activities (to be integrated in the GAD Plan and Budget);
 - t. Quarterly Progress Reports on MOVE activities and outcomes.

4. The Regional GAD Focal Point System shall provide technical assistance, resource materials, and coordination support to Schools Division Offices in the establishment and strengthening of MOVE Chapters. For concerns and clarifications, please contact the Regional GAD Focal Point System.

II. Call to Order

The meeting began with the determination of quorum, out of the 30 members of the Committee, 24 were present. The alternate Chairperson, Asst. Regional Director for Operations, and concurrent OIC Division Chief, Dir. Franco G. Lopez, presided the meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Presiding Officer, Dir. Lopez at 9:00 AM. The meeting formally started with a prayer and singing of the national anthem, via Audio Visual Presentation and acknowledgement of participants by the Led Inter-Agency Regional

Secretariat, Ms. Kathleen Kaye T. Supranes. After which, Dr. Ferdinand M. Benbenen, DOH CV CHD Regional Director gave his welcome message, welcoming the Committee at the DOH CV CHD. On the other hand, the Presiding Officer gave his message, focusing the importance of convening the Committee in a quarterly basis. Moreover, the Presiding Officer expressed his appreciation to the Committee members for regularly attending the meeting which shows their commitment in ending Gender-Based Violence (GBV) concerns in the region. Lastly, the Presiding Officer, thanked the DOH CV CHD in providing the venue of the meeting.

Subsequently, the Presiding Officer presented the proposed agenda for the meeting which are as follows:

- Presentation of the provisional agenda and confirmation of the minutes of the meeting;
- Updates on the agreements of the previous meeting;
- CY 2025-4th Quarter gender-Based Violence Updates in the region;
- Finalization of the RCAT-VAWC Resolutions;
- Finalization of the plans for the 18-day Campaign to End VAW;
- Other Matters; and
- Scheduling of the next meeting.

The Presiding Officer asked the body for additional agenda and having no addendum on the agenda presented, the agenda was unanimously approved.

The Presiding Officer also presented the Minutes of the Meeting and having no corrections or inputs from the body, the minutes of the meeting was approved followed by the presentation of the updates on the agreements of the previous meeting which was presented by the Led Inter-Agency Regional Secretariat, Ms. Kathleen Kaye T. Supranes. Details are as follows:

Having no comments raised, the meeting proceeded to the new business of the meeting.

III. Highlights of Discussion

A. CY 2025-4th Quarter Updates on GBV Cases in the Region

The council quarterly reviews the cases of GBV in the region which came from the Philippine National Police (PNP), Commission on Human Rights (CHR), and Department of Justice (DOJ), to examine the status of cases if there is a decrease or increase. Moreover, these data serve as a guide in improvement of interventions.

For the GBV cases reported to PNP RO2, PMaj. Nieves M. Mena, Chief, Women and Children Protection Desk presented to the body the following details from September to 18 November 2025 generated from the PNP Crime Information, Reporting and Analysis System:

A total of 96 reported cases of GBV. The data shows a decrease of 28.35% from the previous quarter of which 134 cases were reported. The violation on Anti-VAWC recorded the most prevalent GBV case with 44 cases; followed by Rape with 33 cases, and Child Abuse with 29.

Further, victims profile shows that most of the victims are minors aged 4-17 years old, which comprises 51.03% of the total victims of GBV. PMaj. Mena mentioned that said age group is often vulnerable to being raped due to their innocence, lack of understanding, and dependence on adults, which can make them easier targets of perpetrators through the use of force, threats, and intimidation. Moreover, younger victims may be less likely to report the incident due to fear and confusion, or lack of awareness about what has happened to them, which makes them more likely to be targeted by their trusted adults. Accordingly, perpetrators target them because they are easier to manipulate, deceive, or intimidate. The majority of the victims were female, which comprises 89.66%, while there were 15 male victims.

In addition, for the suspect's profile, it has been noted that 136 out of 142 perpetrators or 95.77% of the suspects, are within the age bracket of 18 and above or adults.

Lastly, PMaj. Mena also presented the initiatives of PNP PRO2 in the Prevention GBV which are as follows:

- Lectures on the Laws protecting Children;
- Inter-Agency Coordination;
- Community Dialogue ;
- Distribution of IEC materials;
- Barangay visitation; and
- Oplan Tambuli.

The Presiding Officer acknowledged the efforts of the PNP on its commitment to combat GBV in the region and having no other concerns, the meeting proceeded to the next presenter.

For the GBV cases reported to DOJ NPS RO2, Atty. Maria Liza A. Guzman, Prosecution Attorney, presented the GBV cases reported for the 4th quarter. A total of 523 cases were handled by their office. Atty. Guzman mentioned that the number of cases were seemingly high because the cases were counted per acts committed to the victim-survivors.

The Presiding Officer also acknowledged the efforts of the DOJ NPS RO2 on the cases handled on GBV.

Having no other concerns, the meeting proceeded to the next presenter.

Atty. Marie Grace Divina Marcos of CHR RO2 mentioned that for the quarter, no GBV cases were reported to their office. However, efforts on the provision of technical assistance to LGUs on GBV cases were accomplished. Thus, the Presiding officer also applauded their efforts contributing to the suppression of GBV.

For the NBI CAVRO. Ms. Maria Theresa Bangayan, Senior Agent, informed the body on the sole case of GBV for the quarter. The said case was committed to a one (1) female in Buguey, Cagayan with multiple GBV case. Ms. Bangayan also raised to the body the challenge encountered on the provision of temporary shelter particularly on the Regional Haven for Women and Girls to the victim-survivor during the case management. The Presiding

Officer further inquired on the case and provided DSWD internal appropriate action to the referral system.

The Presiding Officer acknowledged the concerns raised or encountered during case management for improvement of service delivery. Having no other concerns, the meeting proceeded to the next presenters.

For the Province of Cagayan, Ms. Rosario Mandac presented the accomplishment of PCAT-VAWC Cagayan. Highlights of accomplishment were as follows:

- Conducted 3rd Quarter meeting to LCAT-VAWC members;
- Planning of 18-day campaign to end VAW;
- Implementation of Kwarto ni Neneng to GBV victim-survivors particularly rape cases;
- Conducted Basic Business Management Skills Development Orientation to Women KALIPI members and VAWC survivors;
- Coordination with the LSWDO's for the recipients of Livelihood Assistance Grant and Registration of WOMEN KALIPI Organization Provincial Level;
- Activities for 18-day campaign
 - Conduct orientation to students on Safe Spaces Act, OSAEC-CSAEM, VAWC and TIP in coordination with the SDO-Tuguegarao (LCAT-VAWC Members)
 - Organization of MOVE in the PGC
 - Conduct Gender Sensitivity Training to LCAT-VAWC Members

The Presiding Officer applauded the many activities of the Province of Cagayan. Having no other concerns, the meeting proceeded to the next agenda.

B. RCAT-VAWC Resolutions Finalization

The Led Secretariat Ms. Kathleen Kaye T. Supranes presented the proposed the following RCAT-VAWC resolutions:

- **Establishment of Temporary Shelters for GBV victim-survivors in the Local level**
-urging the local government units especially the First Class Municipalities to establish temporary shelters for gender-based violence victim-survivors. The region has the DSWD-managed facility- Regional Haven for Women and Girls, and the Women and Children Protection Center of the Province of Isabela (PSWDO-run facility)
- **Localization of the implementation of RA 11930 or "Anti-Online Sexual Abuse or Exploitation of Children (OSAEC) and Anti-Child Sexual Abuse of Exploitation Materials (CSAEM) Act"**
-urging all LGUs to draft or develop ordinance prohibiting acts of OSAEC and CSAEM with corresponding penalties, thereafter providing a supportive environment for the survivors, and providing funds thereof;
- **Organizing and Strengthening Men Opposed to Violence Against Women Everywhere (MOVE) in the workplace**
-urging the RCAT-VAWC members agencies, other line agencies and the Local Government Units in the region to organize their MOVE Chapters in support to ending violence against women and children and creating a safe workplace

Ms. Supranes informed the body that the resolutions needs to be approved because it will be signed during the 18-day campaign to end VAW. Moreover, the comments and inputs of the Committee members were already incorporated. Hence, the body approved the resolutions.

C. Planning of 18-day Campaign to End Violence Against Women (VAW)

The Led Secretariat, Ms. Kathleen Kaye T. Supranes presented the 18-day Campaign to End VAW to the body. The campaign will run from 25 November to 12 December 2025. Ms. Supranes mentioned that this 2025, the campaign focuses on advancing a **whole-of-nation approach**— mobilizing diverse voices and key players, including youth as change makers, men as proactive allies, bystanders as empowered responders, and local leaders as catalysts for policy-driven transformation, in a shared commitment to fully eliminate gender-based violence, empower survivors, and promote justice. In addition, the Led Secretariat also presented the objectives and suggested activities in support of the said campaign.

For this year's Regional Committee's activity, the Led Secretariat presented the proposed activities of the said campaign which are as follows:

- **Macho Choir Challenge** - Using the creative prowess in dancing, acting, and video production, this challenge is an avenue to raise the voices against catcalling and Gender-Based Sexual Harassment (GBSH) under Republic Act No. 11313 or the Safe Spaces Act. The Challenge features the stakeholders' own rendition of the radio plugs produced by the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW), in partnership with DDB Cares, entitled "Macho Choir", which are three 30-seconder Filipino nursery melodies with lyrics emphasizing that catcalling is a form of sexual harassment.
- **18-day Campaign to End VAW Celebration** – agreed details of this activity are as follows:
