**OBSERVANCE OF THE 38th NATIONAL DISASTER RESILIENCE MONTH
(NDRM) 2026**

1. Pursuant to Executive Order No. 29, s. 2017, and NDRRMC Memorandum No. 110, s. 2026, re: *Observance of the National Disaster Resilience Month (NDRM) 2026*, the Provincial Government of Nueva Vizcaya, in partnership with this Office, enjoins all schools to actively participate in this year's observance of NDRM with the theme, **“NAGHAHANDA at KUMIKILOS Tungo sa PANATAG na BAGONG PILIPINAS.”** The theme highlights the importance of proactive preparedness and sustained action in building safe, adaptive, and disaster-resilient communities, while reinforcing the shared responsibility of all sectors in achieving a secure and resilient Philippines.
2. In line with the month-long observance, the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) will conduct the following student-centered advocacy competitions aimed at promoting disaster resilience awareness, preparedness, and active youth participation:
 - a. **Reels of Resilience** – An Advocacy Video Challenge; and
 - b. **Voices of Resilience** – An Advocacy Video Challenge.
3. Attached are the Guidelines and Mechanics, including the Criteria for Judging, for reference and guidance.
4. All interested schools are encouraged to participate in the competitions. School heads are advised to ensure that **participation does not disrupt classes and that appropriate safety measures and precautions are strictly observed during the production of contest entries.**
5. Immediate dissemination of and compliance with this Memorandum are hereby enjoined.

REELS OF RESILIENCE – VIDEO ADVOCACY CHALLENGE

MECHANICS

1	The “The Reels of Resilience Video Challenge” is open to all public and private high school students in Nueva Vizcaya.
2	Participants may join individually or by team with eight (8)- ten (10) members.
3	Participants shall create an original advocacy video focusing on disaster preparedness, resilience, climate action, environmental sustainability, emergency response, recovery, and community cooperation.
4	Videos may be presented in the form of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Short film; o Documentary; o Public service announcement (PSA); o Spoken word poetry; o Vlog; o Animation; o Dramatization; or o Other creative multimedia formats.
5	Entries must have a minimum duration of two (2) minutes and a maximum duration of five (5) minutes.
6	Videos may be produced in English, Filipino, or local dialects with appropriate subtitles when necessary.
7	Participants may use mobile phones, cameras, editing software, music, sound effects, narration, graphics, and other creative elements, provided that all materials are appropriate and non-offensive.
8	All entries must be original and should not contain plagiarized, discriminatory, political, or inappropriate content.
9	The use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools for voice generation, script generation, or video manipulation shall only be permitted if properly acknowledged and used ethically to support—not replace—the participants’ original creativity and advocacy message.
10	Entries shall be submitted digitally through Google Drive, email, or official submission platforms designated by the Provincial DRRMO.
11	The decision of the Board of Judges shall be final and irrevocable.

VOICES OF RESILIENCE – VOICE ADVOCACY CHALLENGE

MECHANICS

1	The “Voice of Resilience Advocacy Challenge” is open to all public and private high schools in Nueva Vizcaya.
2	Each participating school may send one (1) team composed of three (3) to five (5) members.
3	Participants shall create and perform an original voice drama or radio drama with a duration of two (2) to five (5) minutes only.
4	The voice drama must focus on disaster preparedness, resilience, response, recovery, and the role of youth in building safer and disaster-ready communities.
5	Entries must clearly demonstrate how high school students can utilize their knowledge, creativity, leadership, and practical skills during emergencies and disasters.
6	Participants may incorporate narration, dialogue, sound effects, music, or other creative audio elements, provided that the content remains appropriate and relevant to the theme.
7	The script and performance must be original and should not contain offensive, discriminatory, or plagiarized content.
8	Entries exceeding the maximum time limit shall incur corresponding deductions at the discretion of the Board of Judges.
9	All submitted entries shall become part of the advocacy materials of the Provincial DRRMO and may be used for information and awareness campaigns with proper acknowledgment to the creators.
10	The Champion entry shall be featured on the official Facebook page and aired on the Provincial channel as part of the National Disaster Resilience Month advocacy campaign
11	The decision of the Board of Judges shall be final and irrevocable.
